

## A Parents' Guide to North Cestrian Reports

Reports follow the data captures from the assessments in October, December, March and June. These assessments are synoptic, follow the GCSE style (in terms of proportion, mark weighting and command words) and predict what the likely outcome is therefore going to be at the end of the GCSE.

<p>The pupil's attendance percentage. The national average attendance is 95%. That is North Cestrian's minimum standard for pupils. Below that means progress is being hampered.</p>	<p>Achievement Points are attributed to reward good behaviour for learning and Behaviour Points to sanction poor choices.</p>	<p>The Cestrian Way details the 17 standards of excellent behaviour for learning that are necessary at North Cestrian. The evidence seen in the pupil's performance in assessments to date point to achieving this grade in the actual qualification. The 'progress' is an indication of the current prediction against their target. The targets are based on the required levels set by the government for children completing primary school with certain standards and abilities.

For pupils with an EHCP or are in receipt of Pupil Premium: if the current prediction is behind target, and therefore the Progress box is red, the teacher will write a comment here. Otherwise, teacher feedback and purple pen work will the next steps to improve.
