#### **HEAD'S MESSAGE**

#### Estates

I am pleased to announce that governors have agreed to commission an upgrade to parts of the school's lighting systems. Those sections that were not part of the rebuilding programme that ended in 2019 will have new LED systems installed. The lights will greatly improve the illumination in places like the Vanstone Hall, Hamblin House and the Science Labs, reduce the consumption of electricity – saving money and our carbon footprint. Additionally, the LEDS should prove to be long lasting and reliable, saving maintenance and down time.

### The Holocaust

Although Holocaust Memorial Day has passed by (January), it is important to ensure that we do not forget about atrocities that have occurred in History, simply because it is not the 'official' day of remembrance. The Year 9s have recently been studying the Holocaust and have been reflecting on some of the incomprehensible actions that humans have inflicted on their fellows.

15<sup>th</sup> April is the anniversary of the liberation of Bergen-Belsen Concentration Camp by the British Forces in 1945



30<sup>th</sup> April marks the 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Anne Frank's diary being published, 1952.

If you are able to this Easter break, to take a trip to the Imperial War Museum, Manchester. Entry is free and the exhibits cover World War II and the Holocaust. This will allow pupils to add to their Cultural Capital and develop their understanding of events beyond the classroom.
