#### Head Master's Message:

To paraphrase the late, great Tina Turner, "It's simply Cest Fest". Yes, it's summer and it's one of the key events of the year - CEST FEST. For the uninitiated, this is a whole school summer fair of games, gunge and gastronomic delights. Mark the day – Saturday 8th July 12.00 to 3.00pm. This is organised by our fabulous PTFA and all money raised goes towards funding 'extras' for the pupils to benefit from. I will send a separate email outlining how this all operates.

We are already looking to the start of the new school year. As parents will be aware, pupil places in Trafford are very tight and the radius of catchment areas shrinks year on year. We are a popular school and are heavily over-subscribed. It is right we support Trafford and our local community in providing places as much as we can, and we have twice raised out published admission number (PAN) to do so. We are now reaching the limit of our physical capacity to allow further growth. To accommodate the greater numbers, we have already converted a staffroom to become a classroom and divided our conference room into two classrooms. We have a split lunchtime to cater for playground activities. By and large it works well. However, we are now at the point where we need more classrooms. This would require significant funding by the local authority or the education funding agency. The governors and trustees are pursuing these opportunities. In the meantime, we are looking to place a well provisioned temporary classroom in the upper playground to ensure we have the

capacity to meet our timetabling needs. The middle playground now accommodates the benches and picnic tables and it was lovely to see them fully occupied in the

sunshine this week.

Over the half-term, the site staff (thank you, Pete, Adrian, Malcolm) have done a splendid job smartening the grounds: the Quad garden looks neat and trim and the Eco-garden is now in bloom with an array of flowers and vegetables. Dr Rodger and her Eco Club were delighted to be presented with a certificate from the RHS and a money prize for their work on their 'Bug Hotel' in the Eco-Garden. The Eco-garden has now been furnished by a sheltered garden bench.


