We have spent some time on 'pupil voice' this week: Mr Bell will be sending round a set of questions for pupils to answer about their subjects, as opposed to the whole school. We use the results as a litmus test for the effectiveness of the education we deliver and inform areas for development. It's important to tell the pupils that we do listen, and act and their voice is responded to.

DEPUTY REFLECTIONS - CHARACTER EDUCATION

The first round of pupil voice is now complete. 453 pupils responded and gave a great insight into their experiences of life at North Cestrian.

There is now a second round of pupil voice to find out about pupils' experiences in their subjects. In order to effectively collate the information, each class is sent their own link to the survey (so a generic link or QR cannot be created here).

In 2022...

93% of pupils said that they felt safe at school all the time. So, we listened to those pupils who said they didn't feel safe at school and tried to act on their advice. Since then, we

Removed all queuing outside (where there was potential for "queue jumping" and "older pupils pushing in") in favour of safe and calm queuing inside and by sitting down in the Dining Hall, provided separate spaces and doors for Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4 pupils.


Some younger pupils felt unsafe with older pupils in toilets or on the playground at the same time, so we have provided separate toilets for Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4, enable different lunch times so younger pupils are at leisure while older ones are in lessons (and vice versa), ensure that we protect playground space for calm, relaxation (and give over just the lower playground to ball games.

Are mobile phones harming pupils' concentration?

The latest research has shown that mobile phones pose problems for students' attention in various aspects of their lives, from hindering their learning to reducing enjoyment and engagement in other activities.

A recent studies have suggested that..

- students check their phones on average every 8.6 minutes!
- students who spent more time on phone apps were less likely to get their schoolwork done and more likely to lose track of time.
- the blue light emitted by mobile phones can cause eye strain, fatigue, and disrupts sleep patterns. This further reduces the ability to concentrate and study effectively.
- the mere presence of a mobile phone can make students miss out on the full experience of a fun activity. Notifications, messages, and social media alerts can easily distract them from the present moment and harm both their engagement and enjoyment.

Possible solutions:

- Limit notifications by **changing settings** to choose what is notified and when.
- Let friends know when you are back online to ensure they aren't disturbed and to avoid the temptation of texting during a studying session.
- Declare study space/desk a **phone-free zone** to help improve focus and productivity. Out of sight, out of mind is the key here. Establishing a rule that keeps their phone completely out of their way will increase students' focus on the task at hand and eliminate any potential digital disruptions.
- Use apps to help **limit screen time** apps like Forest incentivises users to refrain from touching their phones for a set period of time by allowing a digital plant to grow as a reward for their discipline.
