Head Master's Message:

Passers-by may only recognise North Cestrian by its frontage. Visitors are amazed by the extent of buildings behind the impressive face of Hamblin House – originally 'Fernlea'. We are a compact site and space is tight. Traffic control is important as cars and pedestrians converge on the small footprint of land. To increase safety, we will soon be installing a traffic safety barrier across the drive, opened electrically and controlled by entry fobs. Visitors will be able to contact reception by intercom. At the same time, we will be improving pedestrian access especially for those approaching from the town side. This also raises the imperative of making appointments before visiting school. If you wish to speak to a member of staff, please contact school ahead and arrange a convenient time: staff cannot drop everything for unannounced visitors.

Teacher Strike

A reminder that pupils will be expected to stay at home on Wednesday 1st February as per my recent communication to all parents. Very few teaching staff will be in school, and they will deliver guided teaching remotely. Teaching Assistants and senior staff will provide lesson time in school for vulnerable pupils and pupils of certain key worker groups. There will be significant periods where no teaching will be available on-line and during these times pupils should exhibit a real sense of purpose and progress with self-directed learning using a range of resources. I have sent home a separate communication with more details.

Cestrian ABC

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The action on Wednesday is a good test of pupils' Cestrian ABC. They have had clear guidance on the best ways to learn. They have developed increased self-discipline born out of clear and high standards in school, and the importance of character development is stressed daily. Pupils now can step up to the mark.



Year 7 News - Mr Bailey



Tickets go on sale this week for Family Easter Egg Bingo taking place on **Friday 24th March**.

So what exactly is it? As the name suggests it is a Family Bingo event, with an Easter twist......

Families buy tickets in advance (£2.00 per person or £5.00 per family of up to 4 people) to come along to play some fun Bingo. Children <u>must</u> be accompanied by an adult, especially the younger children who may need more help.

Doors open at 6.45pm, bar opens at 7pm, eyes down by 7.15pm. We hope to play up to three games of Bingo, as well as one or two other activities, finishing around 9pm.

Bingo cards are provided to everyone with a ticket. We ask that you try and remember to bring your own pen, however there will be some daubers (Bingo pens) there to buy.
