




## DEPUTY REFLECTIONS



Email me with your second response which directly answers the subject specialist's guidance.

Your teacher will respond with "well done" and award a second 3 points. Then guide you to take this further by watching..... listening..... reading....visiting....exploring.

You should then swim in this opportunity and email me the evidence of your development. I will award a third 3 points.

Your teacher will then refer to the sophistication / test your sophistication in verbal interactions in lesson or beyond. Genuine, significant and sustained sophisticated will be awarded with 5 points.

# ENGLISH NEWS

#### 'Inspired By Libraries' with Lemn Sissay

Lemn Sissay is a poet and writer who is now chancellor of The University of Manchester and has been awarded an OBE. He grew up in foster care and children's homes in Wigan. Sissay was born in 1967 to an Ethiopian mother shortly after she moved to England to study but was taken into long-term foster care in Wigan and his childhood suffered greatly as a result. Sissay published his first book of poetry when he was 21 and detailed his experiences in the British care system in his autobiography My Name Is Why. In 1995, he made a BBC documentary, Internal Flight, about his life, and his one-man show Something Dark, which detailed how he was given up as a baby, was adapted for BBC Radio Three in 2006. He became an MBE in the 2010 New Year Honours and took up his post as chancellor of the University of Manchester in 2015.



At this event at Central Library, Manchester, you can join poet Lemn Sissay OBE for an exciting talk aimed at young people, on how libraries have inspired him in his life, taking place at Manchester Central Library as part of the Festival of Libraries 2022. Lemn says, "A library is the loudest place on the high street, because books are bursting with very loud ideas! And yet it is where you can go for peace and quiet; amongst all that is

happening in our world, peace and quiet has great value. Libraries change the world because people who use libraries change the world. This year's Festival of Libraries demonstrates throughout its brilliant programme that all ages, all types, all are welcome. Your community. Your library".
