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Headmaster's Message



The Department for Education has produced a document 'Working Together to Improve School Attendance'. (WTISA) It's 67 pages long. Much is common sense but really offers nothing new to solve the issue of the rise in school absenteeism. This is a national trend and shame. In 2018-19 national secondary school absence rate was 5.5%. Today it is 9.3%. At NCS it is 7.1%. The connection between attendance and attainment is clear: on average, pupils with higher rates of attendance gain higher rates of attainment. There is an even sharper trade-off for those with high absence rates and grades 5 and

over: a higher absence rate appears to significantly reduce the number of higher grades attained. Apart from the impact on academic achievement, absence from school is closely associated with extra-familial harms. 83% of knife possession offenders had records of persistent absence from school. Children missing education can act as a vital warning sign to a range of safeguarding issues. Once a parent enrols their child in a school, they have a legal obligation to ensure they attend each day. Only exceptional circumstances warrant a leave of absence which means..."it is unlikely a leave of absence will be granted for the purposes of a family holiday". (Item 30, WTISA) This is because school attendance is important for the well-being of each child. Please support school in encouraging your child to attend each and every day: point out the benefits. I honestly believe we have a happy school where children can feel safe, learn effectively, and grow as young people – what's not to like?

A letter has been sent to all parents outlining our expectations and processes.

Loreto

We continue to lobby for support and funds to allow North Cestrian to develop school places and facilities on all or part of the land adjacent to us on the Loreto Prep site. There are obvious commercial interests in the site but our case is strong and we remain hopeful to achieve a legacy for young people in this part of Trafford.

Data Sharing

Like most schools in the area, we are part of a protocol that allows us to share relevant data with appropriate third parties to support the local authority's legal obligation to 'assist, encourage and enable young people aged 13 to 19 (and young adults with a learning difficulty and/or disability up to the age of 25) to participate in education or training. In other words, we may legally share information that facilitates this process, while complying with the structures of GDPR. In practice this means we pass on data about pupils' progress and destinations to the local authority so they can track their employment or training status up until they are 19 (or 25 as above).


Staffing





Many thanks to the group of parents who gave their time to read the drafts and sent their ideas.



The Maths Department has been reminding pupils in Maths lessons about upcoming pi festivities. These are to recognise pi as a particularly famous maths number relating to circles, 3.14... (thus the timing of the celebration on 3/14). Here is a summary of Pi Day events to help students prepare, ideally with parent support.

We will again host our **pi recital competition** on 14th March during both KS3 and KS4 lunchtimes. This is a great opportunity for pupils to set themselves targets to learn as many decimal places of pi as they wish and work towards targets set. They can then build on their own personal targets and achievement going forward. All pupils are also welcome to compete against others with those reciting the most decimal places of pi winning prizes.

We will also have a **bake sale.** We invite students to bring pies (either home-made or shop-bought) or cakes decorated to celebrate Pi Day. These treats will then be sold during break and lunch with proceeds going towards ACEF. So the fun of our Pi Day bake sale can also provide maths equipment to children in a poor area of Nairobi, improving their education and opportunities.

Cultural capital opportunities and rewards are also on offer with students being invited to create a pi poster showing interesting facts about pi including its history and applications.

Pi Day activities will also take place during Maths lessons on Pi Day and during the week.
