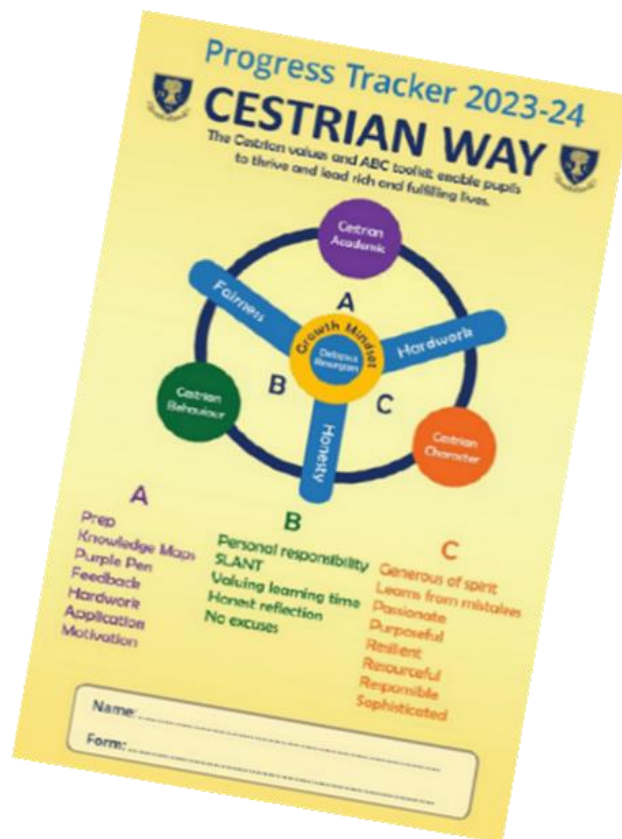

ACADEMIC NEWS



Role Model Cestrians



The Pupil Progress Tracker is a key document that sits at the heart of what we are trying to achieve for our pupils at North Cestrian – independent and reflective learners that take responsibility for their own progress; honest, fair, and hardworking.

The progress tracker is designed to help pupils to:

- Remember important school principles and procedures.
- Remember and organise important information about their learning.
- Record progress, events, achievements, and rewards.
- Reflect and plan to improve their attitude to learning and progress.
- **Pupils need to: take it to every lesson, including form time & briefings.**
- Complete sections when asked to do so; this may be set as a Prep task.
- Keep it clean and tidy – no graffiti.
- Tell form tutors immediately, if they lose trackers.
- Replace lost and damaged Trackers at a cost of £6.
- **Parents need to:** check and use relevant information about school procedures.

- Check and discuss the contents with your child, especially their attitude to learning.
- Support your child in thinking though and reflecting on their learning and progress.
- **Teachers need to:** support and encourage pupils to complete relevant sections.
- Refer pupils to relevant sections of the journal in their teaching of:
 - * Subject Literacy & Numeracy
 - * Cestrian ABC & Attitudes to Learning
 - * Learning Processes & Reflection
 - * School Principals & Procedures

Why are we doing this?

[The Sutton Trust](#) highlights how **metacognitive strategies** add, on average, up to 7 months of additional progress. They explain metacognition and self-regulation approaches “aim to help learners think about their own learning more explicitly. This is usually done by teaching pupils specific strategies to set goals, and monitor and evaluate their own academic development...the intention is often to give pupils a repertoire of strategies to choose from during learning activities”.

Benjamin Franklin used to begin each day by asking himself “**What can I do well today?**”. He then wrote those things down in a diary. Come the end of that day, he would then review each of his goals, making a note of **how he could improve on the things he didn’t do so well**. Research has now confirmed what he knew; that writing a diary had many psychological benefits. It improves self-awareness, helps manage nerves, improves metacognition, helps reduce procrastination, improves your memory and wellbeing. Therefore, the combination of the tracker as a diary and monitor of performance and feedback means that it has the potential to be a very powerful tool to accelerate progress.

These pupils are completing their daily subject reflection/reminder as well as their weekly **Attitude to Learning** reflection. 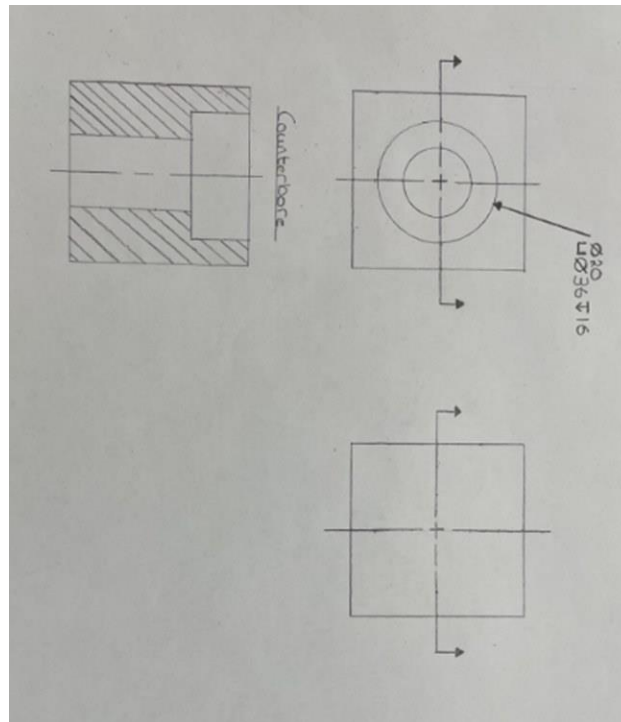

Year 10 are currently learning the skills to be able to complete a similar task in Year 11. They are getting to grips with the 3rd angle orthographic drawings.

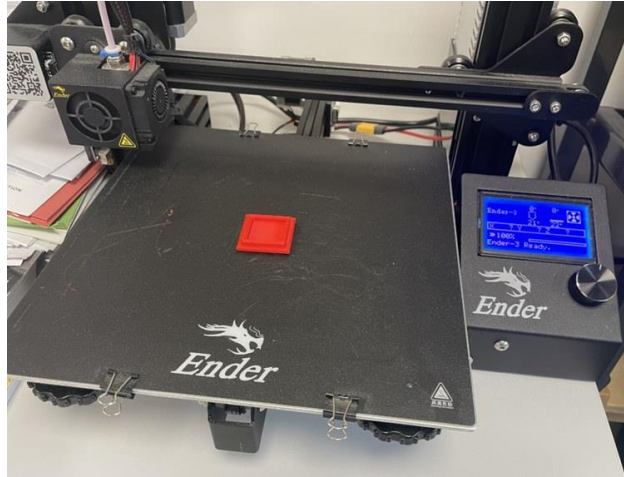


10 - Orthographic Drawing

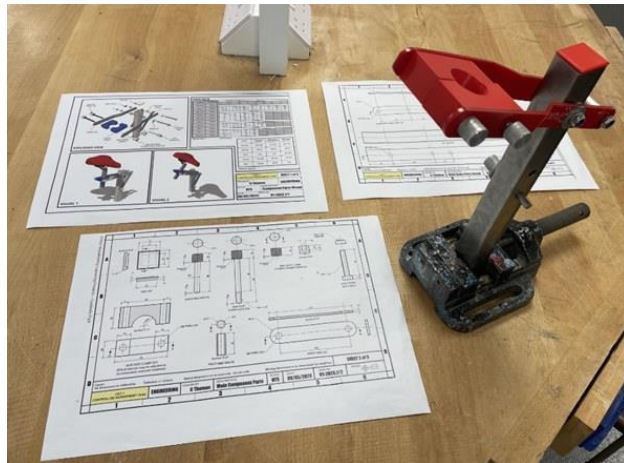

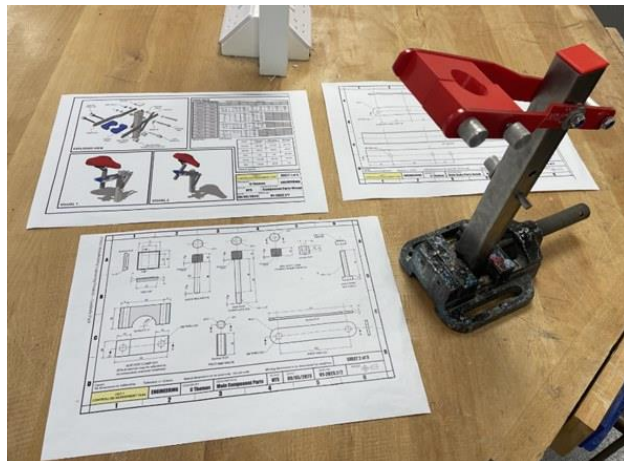

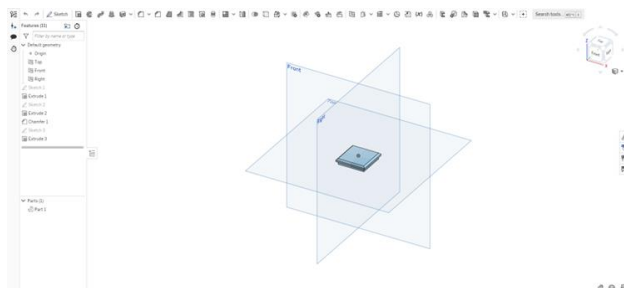
